\*In 06/07, a rule change required a change in how statistics are compiled regarding felony suspensions. A felony suspension is an immediate, interim discipline and after the suspension is entered, the Supreme Court refers the case to a Referee, the Referee files a report and the Court enters an Order with a final discipline. Prior to 06/07, there was a felony suspension and then a follow up case which resulted in 2 Supreme Court Orders being entered for the same conduct.

\*\*Effective Jan. 1, 2006 pursuant to Supreme Court order amending The Rules Regulating The Florida Bar (dated Oct. 6, 2005), a respondent may surrender his/her Florida Bar membership in lieu of defending allegations of disciplinary violations. Disbarment on consent shall have the same effect as and shall be governed by the same rules as disbarment. This rule amendment eliminates disciplinary resignations.
